5. Secretary's Report (DS)

The decision about the ACV for the Cross Lances is still awaited. There is a possibility that the Red Lion, Isleworth will also go through the ACV process.

RED LION, Isleworth; In light of the fact that the previous tenant disappeared and left the pub in trouble and that we were already receiving poor beer quality reports DS proposed that the pub should be removed from the online GBG. Process printed out and given to GG to action.

GG

DS distributed copies of the new beer scoring descriptors as announced recently by CAMRA. The numerical system is being replaced by descriptive levels. The new system goes live on 1st June. DS is planning a beer scoring event for branch members. See appendix 4 for new descriptors.

6. Treasurer's Report (AP)

7. Membership secretary's report (CO)

Branch Membership has declined slightly over the year but not nearly as much as many branches and stands today at 916.

I have sent out welcome letters to all appropriate new joiners and transfers in and submitted regular reports to our Committee through the year.

DS asked where all these members were in light of the fact that we had only seen up to about 50 different members at branch socials. CO explained that it is common in any large membership organisation to have a lot of armchair members and only few that get involved.

8. Press and Publicity Officer Report (JA)

London Drinker

I have written and contributed to articles with photos for London Drinker, about the end of The Victoria Tavern as a traditional "local corner pub" with the retirement of Paul Andrews, the Black Dog POTY presentation, and other Branch activities.

I continue to collect and distribute a number of LDs every 2 months.

Branch activities

As BLO for Twickenham Fine Ales I keep the Branch informed and updated on our latest appeal to NE to restore "The Naked Ladies" to the eligible list of beers for Champion Beer of Britain voting. Still ongoing, under new team.

9. Branch contact, Pub Records Officer, Webmaster & GBG coordinator report

GG read through a summary of the highlights of his report and expressed the need for more people to help with pub information / updates and feedback. He highlighted the complexity of the multiple roles and that website development was on hold as he could not do both jobs. GG expressed desire to step back from one role as branch contact. DS said he would take this on as he had lots of contact through the newsletter.

10. NBSS (DS)

The NBSS summary for the first 4 months Jan – April 2026 was distributed by DS. Number of scored was roughly in line with totals for last year. It was noted that the number of branch scorers was still low at 15 out of 119. DS explained the meaning of the ‘confidence ranking’ column and answered some questions about this.

11. Social secretary (BB)

We have had a busy and successful year of social vents in our area and we hope to continue this in 2026. There has been a small but significant uptick in members attending these. A brief report of past and future events is detailed below:

Regular Pub Social Events:

We have continued with the theme of a regular monthly weekday evening visit to a branch pub, usually moving to one or more nearby venue (s) so that we are able to increase the opportunity for beer scoring. We try to move through out our branch area and to include little visited venues so that there is no bias towards the ‘usual suspects’!

Looking forwards we have the following organised visits:

- Tuesday 26th May: Twickenham Riverside- start at the White Swan at 7:30pm,
- Monday 22nd June: Strand on the Green - start at The Bulls Head at 7:30pm,
- Tuesday 28th July: Beer by Bus - start at the Prince of Wales Fulwell and follows 267 bus route towards Hammersmith at time TBC,

One off Social Events:

One of the changes we introduced in 2025 was ‘different’ socials, meaning:

- Different event types – out of area trips, brewery visits, quizzes, beer festivals, joint socials, meals, beer tasting, etc.
- Different event locations,
- Different event times,

The benefits of this would be to create social events which would hopefully appeal to a wider audience; both existing members and also (hopefully) new members. These events to be publicised in London Drinker along with our area diary.

To date we have had the following:

Out of Area Trips: this included two days visiting the PoTY for each London CAMRA area. Once all have been visited members can vote for their favourite. We also had a bus trip to each of our area Wetherspoons pubs.

Brewery visits: Twickenham, Jawbone, Thameside, Windsor and Eton and most recently Fullers. All of these were well attended and in the case of Thameside and Windsor and Eton we went by train as a very social group!!

Quizzes: we again ran the Beer Knowledge Quiz at The Black Dog Beer House in Brentford. With even more teams the event was our best attended social with more than 70 people! There was also a 'continental' beer quiz held at the Christmas meal (see below).

Meals: just before Christmas we had a German Christmas Meal at the Northumberland Arms in Brentford. This event include a Currywurst cooked by the neighbouring Indian restaurant and a good range of German beers and Real Ales. As well as the quiz we had a Secret Santa with the exchange of members' bottles of ale.

Festivals/Beer Tasting: the Twickenham Wetherspoons kindly invited us to several of their beer festivals and provide FOC third of a pint tasters of each beer and then a pint of each persons favourite.

Joint Socials: a daytime social was well attended with West London starting in Hammersmith and ending up in Barnes.

Future 'One Off' Socials arranged so far include:

Meals: 13th May: Pizza Night at The Mitre in Richmond at 7:30pm. This will not only include excellent food and real ale but we will also be holding the PoTY presentation. Although no date is set we intend to repeat the enjoyable Desi Pub night latter in the year and have a Christmas Meal,

Joint Social: 1st June meeting at the Black Lion in Hammersmith (time TBC) and progressing to some Chiswick pubs. We also hope to undertake a similar event with West Middlesex and Kingston and Leatherhead branches latter in the year.

Beer Festival: 9th July at 3pm we will be attending the Ealing Beer Festival. We may also be assisting with a smaller event at London Welsh RUFC in September.

Brewery Trips: members of the branch are taking the train to Harveys in Sussex and booking onto the 4:30pm brewery tour.

Walks: we would also like to undertake a visit to some of the historic pubs in central London - a date for this to be agreed.

If you have any ideas for a social event or pub to visit please let me know.



Report from George Gimber – Pub Records Officer, Website Manager Branch Contact & GBG Co-ordinator

Branch Web site [<https://rh.camra.org.uk>] – Nothing to report, it continues to be updated as required.

Pub Records Officer

Adding and keeping pub records up to date. This is a significant and ongoing role as Pubs Officer in the Branch. Updates include beer range, opening times, facilities, pub description, name changes, social media links etc and pub status. All this information is incorporated into a database called Pubzilla. I do rely on a very small group of people who report news of these changes together my own research to keep our branch pub records as up to date as possible. Reports from members from other Branches that visit are pubs also received.

Our branch covers a wide area, a large part I'm sure still remains unreported. If you are reading this and know of a change of beer range, management, closure etc please report your news to the Pub Records Officer or online via the CAMRA/pubs web page.

Help keep our information accurate. Submit Feedback - On the CAMRA pub pages there is a 'Suggest an Edit' link on each pub description page. *Notice an error or missing details? Please help our Branch to keep our pub & club information accurate by sharing any corrections or updates found.*

I currently have a long running activity to either update or improve the many pictures that accompany the pub description. There are a number of low-definition pictures that I originally took and used on our Branch web site many years ago. These have been migrated to the CAMRA pubs pages and can now be viewed full screen (on a computer monitor) if selected. Historically these pictures were never intended to be viewed like this and were (in some cases) only 400 pixels in width. Because of this low pixel count, they can look decidedly fuzzy and poor quality and so need to be revised. There are 421 pubs (and Clubs) within our Branch that are represented (can be searched for) on the CAMRA/pubs pages. These are being reviewed and where necessary either re photographed or resized where possible and uploaded to the Pubzilla database and exported to the CAMRA web site.

Pub News

As happening across the country, we continue to lose pubs to closure or change of use. But there is some good news that a pub can subsequently be reopened under new management/ownership and pub turned around and many are now trading successfully. Let's hope this continues. The Lion in Teddington is a good example.

Chiswick

CAMRA – R & H BRANCH AGM 2026 NOTES OF MEETING

A bar last called 'Betty' that closed in January 2023 (after less than two years since opening) has reopened in January 2025 as a new venue called Lil Nashville, a Country Bar & Kitchen providing live country music, line dancing, Southern-style BBQ. This year it won the top hospitality award in the West London Business Awards.

The Fuller's riverside pub the Bell & Crown, Strand on the Green, was closed for 6 weeks for a major refurbishment and reopened in February this year.

Urban Pubs & Bars (a London pub operator) has added five pubs to its growing estate, including the acquisition of four former Food & Fuel sites from The Restaurant Group-owned Brunning & Price. The sites acquired in our Branch area are The Roebuck and The Steam Packet in Chiswick.

Twickenham

The Royal Oak at 13 Richmond Road, has been closed and boarded up. It had been recently up for sale. It is assumed that the expected trade after an expensive refurbishment in 2024 has not been realised. Christian Arden and Ben Abrahams took control of The Royal Oak in October 2024. They also oversee other pubs in southwest London: The Crossing in Barnes, White Horse in Richmond, and New Inn in Ham Common

A note was posted the Riflemen pub in Twickenham stating that it will lose its association with Twickenham Fine Ales Brewery, and therefore is at risk of closure. Since this announcement a Rescue Committee was formed to 'Save the Rifleman' and bring the pub into community ownership. Twickenham Fine Ales, who currently hold the lease, originally stepped in during 2019 in order to keep The Rifleman open. However, the brewery is not in a position to continue managing the pub and The Rifleman is therefore at risk of closure.

A few weeks ago, the Rescue Committee made an offer to Global Mutual (the freehold owner) It has not been accepted at this stage. They also submitted an application to the FCA to establish a Community Benefit Society, which would enable them to take on the day-to-day operation of the pub. Twickenham Fine Ales have agreed to keep The Rifleman open in a caretaking capacity, allowing more time to work towards a long-term solution for the future operation of the pub.

The George at 32 King Street, Twickenham is now under the management of the Morgan Pub Co. and had its grand opening on 25th September 2025.

Teddington

After been closed for three years, The Lion in 27 Wick Road reopened early December 2025 after being purchased by a community consortium and is now thriving, providing a much-needed asset in the area.

The Adelaide pub at 57 Park Road Teddington is now operated by Morgan Pub Co. It looks to be a similar business arrangement with Shepherd Neame employed at the Swan in Hampton Wick.

The Masons Arms in Teddington and Express Tavern in Brentford, have both been included in The Telegraph's expert guide to the 500 Best Pubs in England, compiled by Will Hawkes.

Isleworth

CAMRA – R & H BRANCH AGM 2026 NOTES OF MEETING

The Victoria Tavern, Isleworth, re-opened in September 2025 under new owners and now trading as a modern-styled sports bar. Live music and real ale continue.

The Red Lion in Linkfield Road was closed for a few days and now under new (temporary?) management from April 2026.

Kew

The Cricketers in Kew reopen under new management after a refurbishment in September 2025 under its original name The Rose & Crown. The pub at 79 Kew Green is now owned by Inda Pubs. A family-owned business with nine neighbourhood pubs across West London. It serves Fullers Pride and Timothy Taylor Landlord when it opened.

Feltham

After a number of changes to its management the Airman has finally succumbed to being changed to a restaurant call Everest Spice Lounge in August 2025.

Hounslow

The Cross Lances in Hounslow, re-opened on 15th September 2025 under new management. It has been refurbished and is now owned by a local Nepalese restaurant.

The Sun at 148 Hanworth Road has had a 'make-over' and renamed The Hanworth. The pub reopened in April 2025.

Hampton

The Railway Bell (aka The Dip) was closed after its long-standing Tenant died in April 2024. The pub's future looks uncertain until a local 'Save The Dip' campaign group has formed by Robert Lee. The pub has subsequently been declared an Asset of Community Value by Richmond Council. A notable success for the campaign that has the support of ~450 members. The decision means that the 'Save The Dip' campaign group now has priority should it wish to buy the freehold of the pub, which has been closed for over a year. Hampton Hill

The Stonegate pub company, announced plans to sell 23 free-of-tie sites as part of its portfolio review. Savills Estate & Letting Agents have been instructed to manage the sale of the pubs, on behalf of Stonegate. Of these 23 pubs being sold only one is in our Branch area, namely The Star, Hampton Hill. No further information is currently known.

Hampton Court

The Six restaurant & bar/Kings Arms Hotel at 2 Lion Gate, Hampton Court Road, was closed in August 2025 and currently on the market with Cattaneo Commercial.

Richmond

The venue previously called Incognito in 2-3 Duke Street that closed in 2024 reopened as the Nowhere in July 2025. This venture has now closed. The pub was originally called Cobwebs.

The Crane Tap, a modern restaurant and bar opposite Twickenham Station is now under new management by Morgan Pub Co.

GBG Coordinator

CAMRA – R & H BRANCH AGM 2026 NOTES OF MEETING

Our Branch submitted 18 pub candidates (our allotted number) plus three reserves to the Greater London CAMRA GBG Submissions Co-ordinator by the deadline set. These pub entries in Pubzilla were edited from the survey reports and exported to the GBG publishing system. This year we had to meet a new requirement of limiting pub descriptions to 50 words, instead of 80 in previous years. I understand this may change in the future when CAMRA's new Trading Committee start work. One of their projects is to review the Good Beer Guide format against agreed targets, while looking at innovative ways to increase CAMRA's income.
